The UAE and Israel: A Warm Peace

The historic normalization agreement between the United Arab Emirates and Israel is

transforming the Middle East. As two of the region's most dynamic economies and vibrant societies, closer UAE-Israel ties are accelerating growth and innovation, expanding opportunities for young people, and building bonds of trust. With strong bipartisan US support, diplomatic normalization is fostering increased trade, investment, cultural exchanges, and people-to-people ties.



UAE Foreign Affairs Minister HH Sheikh Abdullah bin Zayed attended the Negev Summit in Israel with his counterparts from the US, Israel, Egypt, Morocco, and Bahrain on April 4, 2022.

The governments of UAE, Jordan, and Israel signed a landmark declaration of intent to build renewable electricity and water desalination capacity in November 2021.

- UAE-Israel trade is expected to reach \$6.5 billion annually.
- The UAE and Israel finalized a free trade agreement expanding economic relations in April 2022.
- The UAE's Masdar and Israel's EDF Renewables are exploring renewable energy opportunities.
- Emirati and Israeli universities are working together on the development and ethical use of A.I.
- Over 300,000 Israelis have visited the UAE with numerous direct flights connecting the two countries.
- In September 2021, a joint Israel and UAE mission rescued dozens of Afghan women and human rights activists from Kabul in the aftermath of the Taliban takeover of Afghanistan.

Key Dates and Milestones

2019

The UAE announced the establishment of the Abrahamic Family House in Abu Dhabi where a mosque, church, and synagogue would be co-located in the same complex.

August 13, 2020

The US, UAE, and Israel announce a historic normalization agreement.

September–December, 2020 Bahrain, Sudan, and Morocco join the UAE in this effort, entering into normalization agreements with Israel in September, October, and December.

November 15, 2021

Israeli Ambassador Amir Hayek takes up diplomatic post in the UAE.

March 28, 2022

Foreign Ministers of the UAE, US, Israel, Bahrain, Egypt, and Morocco partake in the Negev Summit in Israel.

June 12, 2020

Writing in an Israeli newspaper in Hebrew, UAE Ambassador to the US Yousef Al Otaiba outlines the benefits to Israelis of pursuing peace and normalization with the UAE. A poll taken days after this article was published revealed nearly 80% of Israelis preferred normalization to annexation.

September 15, 2020 Abraham Accords are officially signed at the

White House.

February, 2021 Mohamed Al Khaja appointed as the first UAE ambassador to Israel.

December 13, 2021

Israeli Prime Minister Naftali Bennett meets with HH Sheikh Mohammed bin Zayed in Abu Dhabi.
